On October 30, 2023, the Tallahassee Collegiate Academy (TCA) Board of Trustees meeting was called to order by Trustee Karen Moore at 5:59 p.m.

COMMENTS:

- i. **Board Chair** Trustee Moore concurred with comments made by the Trustees, and believes TCA is hitting every benchmark for TCA being first in class.
- ii. **Board Members-** Trustee Kelling commented that things seem to be going amazingly well and was impressed at the hands-on approach TCA is using and the happy faces of students; Trustee Pople agreed that TCA is doing very wonderful. Trustees Clark and Taylor attended the Cyber Security Symposium held at TCA earlier in the day and were very impressed with the level of engagement from the students of all backgrounds, as well as the community partners who attended.

NEW BUSINESS

a. Principal's Report- Teacher Presentation

Principal Chapman introduced Christy Baldwin, who serves as the Biology and Agriculture teacher, as well as being the parent of a student enrolled at TCA. Ms. Baldwin shared her perspective as a parent, saying her child is the most engaged with school he has ever been, and she finds comfort in knowing he will be successful and ready for the future when he graduates. Ms. Baldwin also shared her perspective as a teacher, giving a demonstration of a project her agriculture students are working on to landscape around TCA's campus, and showing how students are not just going through the motions of learning by talking about it, but instead are hands-on doing it.

a. Academic Goals – 2023-2024

Principal Chapman requested Board approval of the proposed academic achievement goals for the 2023-2024 academic year. These academic achievement goals are developed to monitor the teaching and learning process to ensure student learning needs are being met.

b. Schedule of Observations

Principal Chapman requested Board approval of the proposed Schedule of Teacher Observations for the 2023-2024 school year, outlining the frequency at which educators will be observed and rated at TCA. Teachers are placed into categories based on years of teaching experience, and observations will be done in a formal, informal, and walkthrough manner.

c. Projected Enrollment – 2024-2025

Principal Chapman requested Board approval for increasing enrollment numbers to 125 new students for the 2024-2025 school year. This number was originally set at 100 new incoming students and has been increased to 125 to even out the number of students enrolled in 9th and 10th grades.

d. MOU – USF – Florida's RTI Project

Principal Chapman requested Board approval for a Memorandum of Understanding with USF. This project would provide support to TCA and their Problem Solving and Response to Intervention team with services for special populations, in compliance with FERPA laws. This project is funded through FDOE, with no cost to the school.

e. Service Contract – Speech

Principal Chapman requested Board approval for a service contract with Talk of the Town Speech Therapy, LLC. This service contract was created due to a student requiring speech services, as TCA does not currently have a licensed speech therapist on staff.

SUBJECT: Academic Achievement Goals Update

Item Description

This item provides an update regarding the proposed academic achievement goals for this academic year, 2023-2024.

Overview and Background

Schools develop academic achievement goals each year to monitor the teaching and learning outcomes. During the October meeting, the TCA board approved the academic achievement goals for the year. This item provides an academic update on the goals.

ELA: 66% of our students are showing proficiency to date. 2023-2024 Goal: 64% (exceeded goal as of November)

Math: 58% of our students are showing proficiency. 2023-2024 Goal: 60% (two percentage points away from meeting goal)

US History: 70% of our students are showing proficiency with the current content. 2023-2024 Goal: 77% (seven percentage points away from our goal)

Biology: 70% of our students are showing proficiency with the current content. 2023-2024 Goal: 72% (two percentage points away from our goal)
